WHEREAS, a verified petition has been filed in the above-entitled Court in the interest of the above named child/ren alleging facts or circumstances of neglect, abuse, or dependency that bring said child/children within the jurisdiction of the Juvenile Court; and based on information presented at the shelter hearing and available to the Court it appears that:

- Continuation in the home would be contrary to the welfare of the child(ren) removal is in their best interest; And
- Reasonable efforts have been made by DFS/other agency to prevent placement outside of the home, OR
- Due to the emergency situation which exists, the lack of preventative efforts is reasonable. *— then why wasn't he hospitalized? —>*

It is in the best interest of the child(ren) to be placed in the temporary care and custody of the Division of Child and Family Services pending further hearing on the matter.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:

1. Pursuant to Section 78-3a-306, UCA 1994, temporary legal custody of the above named child(ren) be, and is hereby placed with the Division of Child and Family Services pending further hearing and subject to further Court Order.
2. Unless a further Court Order shall otherwise provide, this temporary order of custody shall remain in effect until adjudication of the petition to which it relates or the expiration of 6 months, whichever occurs first.
3. The parents or guardian are hereby ordered to meet with the Office of Recovery Services within ten days to determine a reasonable contribution for the support of said children based upon current household income and the Uniform Child Support Guidelines for the period that said children are in the custody of the Division of Child and Family Services.
